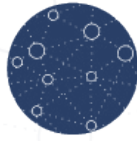

Over the past 20 years, **CPCRN has been a trusted, nationwide network working to prevent and control cancer.** We bridge science and practice to **improve health and lower healthcare costs.**

Cancer Burden in America

In 2025, approximately two million new cancer cases will be diagnosed, and nearly 620,000 deaths will occur in the United States. Over 40% of all cancer cases and nearly 50% of cancer deaths are preventable. Many cancers can be cured if detected early and treated effectively.

Saves healthcare costs

CPCRN proactively mails cancer screening kits and provides support for follow-up colonoscopies.

This initiative **tripled screening rates and helped save healthcare spending in rural and Medicaid populations.**

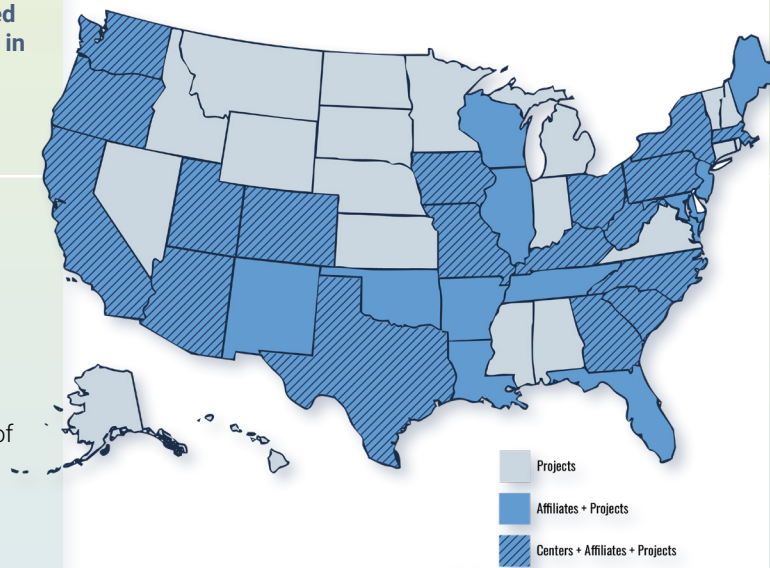
Supports cancer survivors & expands survivor support

Roughly 18.6 million Americans have a history of cancer.

CPCRN initiatives **expand survivorship support by informing state programs, improving care coordination, and addressing rural access gaps.**

Informs policy

CPCRN shares research evidence with policymakers to improve health for all.

CPCRN works with health leaders to **increase awareness of rising cancer risk and recommend statewide strategies to improve cancer care.**

Increases access to cancer screening

Increasing screening access reduces death rates for cancers like colorectal, breast, lung and cervical.

CPCRN partners with Federally Qualified Health Centers to **improve the accessibility of cancer screenings for Americans in rural Appalachia.**

Supports healthy lifestyle programs

Healthy behavior changes can reduce cancer risk by 40%.

CPCRN provides tailored support to faith-based community organizations in rural South Carolina to **deliver evidence-based nutrition and physical activity workshops, trainings, and toolkits.**

Trains our healthcare workforce

Over 2,000 healthcare practitioners have been trained using CPCRN's curriculum.

CPCRN trains health agencies to expand the use of proven cancer interventions, further **building workforce capacity across America.**

The Cancer Prevention and Control Research Network is supported by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and was established by CDC and the National Cancer Institute (NCI) in 2002.
