

Getting Vaccinated

Who Can Get Vaccinated?

Since all individuals living in the US are eligible for the vaccine, vaccine providers CANNOT require proof of identification or insurance; while this information may be requested by vaccine providers, individuals who do not present documentation can still receive a vaccine¹. Thus, no formal documentation needs to be presented by the individual to receive a vaccine.

Table 1: Documentation Requirements to Administer COVID-19 Vaccinations

Documentation/Identification	Required by the individual for a vaccine	NOT required by the individual for a vaccine
Proof of citizenship (e.g., birth certificate, passport, etc.)		X
Health Insurance Card		X
Social Security Number		X
Driver's license/State ID		X
Proof of identification (e.g. work/school ID, driver's license, etc.)		X
Vaccination card		X
